Columbarium Report 2025

Introduction

Many members of our congregation may not be aware that our church has a Columbarium located alongside our building on Churchcroft Drive. The Columbarium is the brick wall visible as you approach the driveway to our parking lots.

Purpose and Capacity

The Columbarium was established around 1995 in response to the needs of church members seeking an affordable way to inter their loved ones and have them nearby. It has the capacity to hold up to 160 urns. As of now, approximately 80 niches are available for purchase.

Costs

Each niche is priced at \$500 and can be purchased by church members and their families. The current cost for interning a loved one is \$350. This fee covers the removal and replacement of the panel, engraving, and the interment of the remains. Please note that the engraving and interment costs are charged at the time of interment and may vary according to prevailing market rates.

Recent Improvements and Gratitude

The Columbarium Committee extends heartfelt gratitude to Bill Chapman, Joyelle Tedeschi, Roman Tedeschi & Christina Jarlenski who worked diligently this past month to

clean up and repair the stone walkway and sitting area.

Committee Membership and Volunteering

We are pleased to welcome Sue Fleming as a new member of our committee and continue to look forward to filling additional vacancies on our

board. We are seeking individuals interested in helping oversee the Columbarium. The time commitment is minimal, as meetings are scheduled on an as-needed basis.

Applicants should have basic Microsoft and computer skills, particularly with Excel, Word, and Publisher, and be able to work

sensitively with bereaved families to coordinate and prepare the niche for interment.

All items not taken in the estate sale will be removed from the church in a full clean out. No items will remain.

This work should be completed by the end of September 2025. Members of both churches will be provided with the dates above once the calendar has been finalized.


Hope & Joy Food Pantry News:

This year so far we helped 8,213 people. Pounds of food received 30,400. Due to the rise of needs, Pantry Board is considering adding another additional shift. The community garden is starting to produce. Donations were given by Spoth's; Tractor Supply, Lowe's, Leo Brenan for soil and plants. Applied for NYS Grant Opportunity to improve our garden. Received an operational grant, amount unknown at this time.

Our next scheduled church work day will be Saturday,

October 11 from 9am - 12pm. We have some painting projects and touch ups that need to be done; along with putting on the air conditioner covers and winterizing the building. Donuts and coffee will be served. Many hands make light work. Remember with church volunteers doing the maintenance and cleaning, we are saving \$20,000 in our 2024 budgets.

Volleyball Court Update

We're exploring options to restore the volleyball court and prevent the return of grass and weeds. After talking to landscaping experts, we learned that simply tilling and adding more sand—as has been done in the past—will not be a long-term solution. To create a lasting fix without using chemicals, the recommended approach is to lay down a weed barrier, followed by a large amount of sand (some have also suggested a layer of rock beneath the sand). Joy is currently gathering quotes and exploring possible interim solutions. As you can understand, there are other financial priorities for the church, so we want to be thoughtful about the approach. Once estimates are in, we will also look into recreational grants that could help fund the project. If you have access to donated sand or weed cover, please let Joy know. Thank you for your patience and support! —Joy

Constitution and Bylaws Committee

A crucial step in the merger of St. Stephen's Bethlehem and Kenilworth Churches will be the creation and approval of a new constitution and bylaws. Pastor Ruth Snyder, who previously chaired the committee responsible for updating the Western NY Area Churches in Covenant's bylaws, has offered to lead a joint committee composed of members from both congregations.

Kenilworth's Church Council has chosen Mary Martino and Bob Christmann as its representatives, while St. Stephen's Bethlehem Leadership Team has appointed Peter Nichols and Cody Mejeur. Meetings for this joint committee are scheduled to commence after Labor Day. The anticipated process includes the committee reviewing current documents and preparing an initial draft. This draft will be submitted to each congregation's Church Council or Leadership Team for feedback. Following revisions, a revised

draft will be distributed to both congregation's leaders. Subsequently, a joint meeting of Kenilworth's Church Council and St. Stephen's Bethlehem Leadership Team will be convened for further evaluation and discussion. Once this group finalizes a proposed draft, it will be sent to both congregation's members for their consideration.

To foster transparency and gather input, at least two town hall sessions will be organized, allowing members from both congregations to share feedback. Additional revisions will be made as necessary, and the final version will be circulated to everyone. Each congregation will then hold a vote to adopt the finalized constitution and bylaws.

This undertaking is significant and challenging. We kindly ask for your prayers and support for the committee as we begin this important task.




